

Each sentence imposed as specified in (a) through (f) of paragraph (4) above imposed on petitioner on 04/09/1996 in Williamsburg, James City County.

Each sentence imposed in (g) through (m) of paragraph (4) above was imposed on petitioner on 02/07/1996, except for offense (k) Possession of cocaine, which was first imposed on 05/18/1995 and was then revoked on 03/28/1996. As they were all imposed on Petitioner in York County.

### Introduction

Pleasant greetings Honorable Ralph Northam, Governor of Virginia,

I, Ransom R. Grandel, humbly come before your office to submit this petition for a Conditional Pardon. I am seeking a Commutation of my current sentence, in accordance with the powers granted unto the Governor under Virginia's Constitution and Law. I am an offender who is currently housed at Sussex II State Prison. I am 44 years of age, and I have currently served 24 years of a single life, forty-eight years, twelve months, and seventy-day sentence. The single-life, twelve years, and four months is the portion of the sentence that allows me to be parole eligible. The remaining thirty-six years, eight-months, and seventy-days are sentences under the "New Law" (1995). I am also a first-time offender in the Virginia Department of Corrections, and I do not have any out-of-state or federal convictions.

As you read and research the following information that I shall provide in this packet, I pray that you are able to see and witness the rehabilitated

man that I have become. A man who wishes to be deemed worthy of being selected to be given a second chance in society. I am before you as a man who has prepared himself for a return to society, I have family, friends, and other upstanding citizens in the community who support my release.

A part of my transitional change can be seen by viewing my institutional offender disciplinary actions sheet. It will show the exact number of infractions I've incurred over my 24 years of incarceration; none of which were incidents of violence.

I have also included a copy of my marriage certificate, G.E.D., two trades, and a catalog of self-help programs that I have achieved during my time of incarceration. I pray that all my accomplishments add more substance to my current character. I have also included a copy of my most recent institutional classification authority hearing, it gives an accurate update of my current annual review and legal update assessment, from the Department of Corrections.

# Extraordinary Circumstances

While facing the challenges of society as a dysfunctional, uneducated adolescent, I was placed into a community group home, and assigned a probation officer. I became a resident at this place from December 04, 1990. I was released on June

25,1991. It was only upon receiving my court transcripts that I came across this discharge summary that had been prepared by my then counselor, Ms. Teresa M. Brandt, and approved by the program manager, Mr. Ronald C. Wallace of the Crossroad Community Group Home.

It had been sent to the office of Mr. Ralph Craft at the request of Ms. Lillie A. Epps, Probation & Parole Officer. She sent a copy to the Honorable, Samuel T. Powell III, the judge who presided over my trial. In it was revealed to us that my mental instability was not standard of a competent teenager. A copy of this discharge summary has also been submitted with this petition. (See page #9-12). It shall stand a testament to my mental instability as an adolescent. It will show that I was behind in decision making, communication, and basic living skills.

Please note that this revelation is not an attempt to make an excuse for my past actions, however, my intention is to make a point by adding sustenance, as well as, to provide some proof of my dysfunctional mind state during my adolescent life.
